ORCHARD MANOR PICNIC A SUCCESS



THE TREASURER'S TALES SEPTEMBER 2019

September 1924 marked the return to school for Barney. He had the summer off, which also meant off-pay. He was busy farming and finishing his new house when he wasn't doing things for the Odd Fellows. The weather was still warm in September and baseball was still the national pass-time. There were no TV's, very few radios and movies were silent.

On September 10, 1924 the New York Giants defeated the Boston Braves 22-1, with Frisch going 6 for 6 until he grounded out. Also on the 10th Leopold and Loeb were found guilty of the murder of Robert Franks in Chicago in the "the crime of the century." Read about Leopold and Loeb here: https://www.britannica.com/biography/Leopold-and-Loeb. On the 14th Walter Johnson was selected Most Valuable Player in the American League. On September 16, Cardinal Jim Bottomley batted in 12 runs in a single game. On September 29, the Washington Senators clinched the American League pennant, finishing two games ahead of the Yankees.

Dallas Cowboys coach Tom Landry was born on September 11. Lauren Bacall was born on the 16th, and Truman Capote was born on the 30th.

A number of interesting books were published in 1924; The Land that Time Forgot by Edgar Rice Burroughs, Poirot Investigates by Agatha Christie, A Passage to India by E. M. Forster, and The Dream by H. G. Wells. People were watching the following movies; The Thief of Baghdad, Greed, The Marriage Circle, Girl Shy, The Sea Hawk, Hot Water and Monsieur Beaucaire. Barney was trying to pull all the little ends together on his new house, Elizabeth was pregnant and so was the neighbor's dog. The neighbor (Barney's father) accused Warden of being the father and told Barney he would have to take care of half the litter of pups. Giving away puppies isn't too hard for a high school teacher, but the parents have a tendency to look at a new puppy differently from the students.

Barney, with all his summer complications, had raised a bumper crop of sweet corn. He had more than he could sell and he had plenty of field corn for the cattle, chickens and hogs. So he decided the lodge would hold a corn roast. Hot dogs and corn on the cob, the Saturday before Labor Day. The lodge was going to make money on this event, charging \$0.50 for two hot dogs and all the corn you could eat. I know what you are thinking, the little raccoons will get into the corn and create a comical event to disturb the corn roast. I won't be led into exploiting Melchizedek and his family for such crass purposes. He was given an ear of corn at the start and that was to be it. He returned with the whole family and they got to pick over the used cobs, so that ends the raccoon line of the story.

Sales were going great, until the thunder started booming and the rain poured. The sale was behind the Odd Fellows Hall, so they went inside. Sales fell a little, but the crowd went on most of the day. Every child who could beg or borrow (and perhaps steal) a half dollar, wanted a shot to see how many ears of corn he could eat. One of Barney's tenth grade English students won, with 27 ears of corn. She was not seen at the Labor Day picnic on Monday and didn't make it to school until Wednesday. She is said to hold the unofficial New Jersey corn eating record for women. We won't follow that line any further.

The pile of cobs behind the lodge hall grew quite tall, and their was Melchizedek and his whole family, eating like little pigs. When you offer people all they can eat young people get competitive, as I mentioned above. Sometimes the unprepared become ill from eating too much corn. There was a mopping detail for the dining hall. This was supposed to be an outdoor event. Some of the more refined adults (if such exists at a corn roast) would want to limit the corn intake and have some sort of dessert. Anticipating this, each of the members had his wife bake a cake, which was sold for fifteen cents a piece. The lodge did well. You must remember we are in 1924. The fifty cent ticket would be \$7.58 today and the fifteen cent piece of cake would be \$2.24. All the food was donated, including the hot dogs and buns, pure profit. Sales proceeds were \$91.30, the equivalent of \$1,367.59. This, and one more fund raiser, would support the Halloween party we may discuss next month.

While at the second lodge meeting in September, many of the brothers discussed the corn roast. A resolution was passed to thank brother Barney for donating the corn and supervising the entire affair from picking corn to cleaning up the cobs (that were given to the hogs). The brothers then wanted to make Barney chairman for the Halloween Party. Barney tried to decline, but he was not able to. As you may recall from your youth in FFA, many farmers plant pumpkins with their corn.
