THE TREASURER'S TALES

AUGUST 2020

We find our hero, Barney Wells, preparing to gain greater recognition in the Order. In August 1925 there was a Mid-Atlantic IOOF Convention in Baltimore. It covered the jurisdictions of New Jersey, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware and the District of Columbia. It shall be the primary topic for our column.

On August 3, 1925, U.S. Troops left Nicaragua, they had been there since 1912, a thirteen year occupation. On August 9, 1925 Bobby Veach pinch-hit for Babe Ruth, the only time anyone pinch hit for the Babe; Veach flied out. On August 14 the Mount Rushmore monument was proposed. On August 31, Anthropologist Margaret Mead lands on Samoa. On August 12 Norris and Ross McWhirter were born, the twin founders of the Guinness Book of World Records. On August 16 Phillies' third-baseman Willie Jones was born.

One of the most popular movies of 1925 was *The Lost World*, starring Wallace Beery. You can watch it on YouTube, here: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QJaXxY3citM>.

While some conventions are designed as trade shows, the Odd Fellow convention of 1925 was a chance to mingle and exchange ideas on various things to do with the fraternity. The most unusual exhibit at this convention was a goat farmer, who rented out trained goats. There were gentle goats, wild goats and kids that were not for riding but rather for show. DeMoulin Brothers, a costume maker, (<http://www.demoulinmuseum.org/>) had a display. Each degree was exemplified in fine costume by players who had committed the parts to memory. Barney was amazed at the acting skill that was shown that day.

The convention began on Friday, August 23, 1925 and ended on Sunday. Elizabeth was too busy with the children and Barney's father was tied up with the farm. The farm hand quit the week before the convention and milking was too great a task for Barney's father to leave up to a new employee. Elizabeth trusted Barney not to get into trouble, but thought she should have someone there to look after him, since the convention was in the wild and woolly town of Baltimore, home of Thomas Wildey.

Elizabeth convinced her father, Vic, to accompany Barney. This would prove to be a bad idea. Barney and Vic were both somewhat adventurous. The various workshops, lectures and displays were of interest, but the games were more intriguing. Several games had trophies or other small awards. Vic gave the best Past Grand's Charge and received a certificate for his efforts.

The biggest prize, \$10.00, went to the person who could eat the most raw oysters on a half shell in ten minutes. Both Vic and Barney entered.

The contestants were to pay a \$0.50 admission fee. For their admission fee, the contestants received all the freshly shucked oysters they could eat and all the near beer (see: https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Low-alcohol_beer) they could drink. Since Prohibition was on, only near beer could be consumed. Raw oysters and beer created an atmosphere that was open to disastrous consequences. The contest was to start at 7:00 pm on Friday, but the registered contestants started to arrive at 6:00 pm, with free beer flowing prior to the contest. The contest was to end at 7:10 pm.

Barney and Vic were at different tables. There were over fifty contestants. The Grand Master of Maryland was the final Judge, with three dozen time-keepers and oyster shuckers. Each contestant started with 24 oysters (and a few ended with 24). There were pitchers of beer everywhere to wash the oysters down. The more congenial Odd Fellows had drunk two or three mugs of beer prior to the starting time (bad if you hoped to win the contest). Vic and Barney decided to be congenial.

Barney was a fairly large young man in his late 20's. He stood almost six feet tall and weighed close to 200 pounds. He worked on the farm and was accustomed to a large farm meal. He was a contender. Vic was a small man in his early 60's. He stood five feet three inches and weighed less than 140 pounds. Vic could pass on a couple meals and do an admirable job at a banquet. Unfortunately, neither of our heroes knew about the contest far enough in advance to prepare. They both had a large lunch and shared a pitcher of lemonade, which they finished off.

At 7:00 pm sharp a whistle blew and platters of raw oysters and pitchers of beer were set out. When the second whistle blast was sounded, it was time to dig in. Vic was able to start the second platter of 24, but somewhere around 30 he faded and dropped out. He was about the middle of the pack. Barney was giving it his best, he finished the second platter and started the third. At 55 oysters, Barney decided he had too much beer and oysters and ended his run.

It was no surprise the winner was from Maryland. Oysters were on the menu every day. The winner ate almost 100 oysters in ten minutes. No one was close him. With 55 oysters, Barney had taken fifth place. The certificate and a \$10.00 gold note were handed out and the winner received wide applause.

As Vic and Barney stumbled from the hall where the contest took place, they ran into a member of the Encampment in Trenton. He asked if they wanted to join him for dinner. Vic

made a polite refusal while Barney was changing color and looked a bit like the shells the oysters were served on. They arrived at the hotel where Barney and Vic shared a room. Barney wanted to sit in a chair and relax.

It was August and the temperature was 92 degrees, with no air conditioning. Though it was 1925, the hotel was built in 1894. There was one men's room and one ladies room on each floor, you had to wait your turn to take a bath or use the toilet. Twenty rooms on each floor. There was an elevator but it was manually operated and the operator stopped on every floor, whether there was someone there or not. The hotel was tall and narrow and had 34 floors. Barney and Vic were lucky, their room was on the 15th floor.

By 8:00 pm Barney felt ill. He hurried to the bathroom, but there was a line. It seems that 10 other rooms on his floor housed contestants in the oyster contest. He raced down the back stairs to the 14th floor, only to find another line. There was no 13th floor, so his next trip down the stairs took him to the 12th. The line was shorter, but there were still two people ahead of him. Looking to his left, Barney saw there was no line and the door to the ladies room was open. He bolted in and shut the door. After he left the ladies room he felt better, but still couldn't walk up to the 15th floor. He waited for what seemed like an eternity for the elevator and finally got back to his room. He noticed Vic was standing in line for the men's room.

Saturday morning came too soon. Vic and Barney both had headaches and Barney couldn't look at the tomato juice that came with breakfast. At 10:30 am, they slid into their seats to watch the drill team competition. No lunch for either of our heroes, the featured item, despite the summer weather, was oyster stew. Sunday afternoon Barney was feeling a little better and made the drive home in four hours. The model T had a bumpy ride and Barney needed to stop twice. When he walked into the house at 6:30 pm, Elizabeth had dinner prepared for him. Barney had to eat one piece of chicken and a biscuit before he told Elizabeth he had to go to bed. The next morning, Elizabeth went to see Alice, her mother. They discussed the convention and condition their spouses were in when they returned. They decided Vic and Barney could not serve as chaperones for each other. There would be no more conventions without wives.

He was a member of Faith Community United Methodist Church in Atglen.

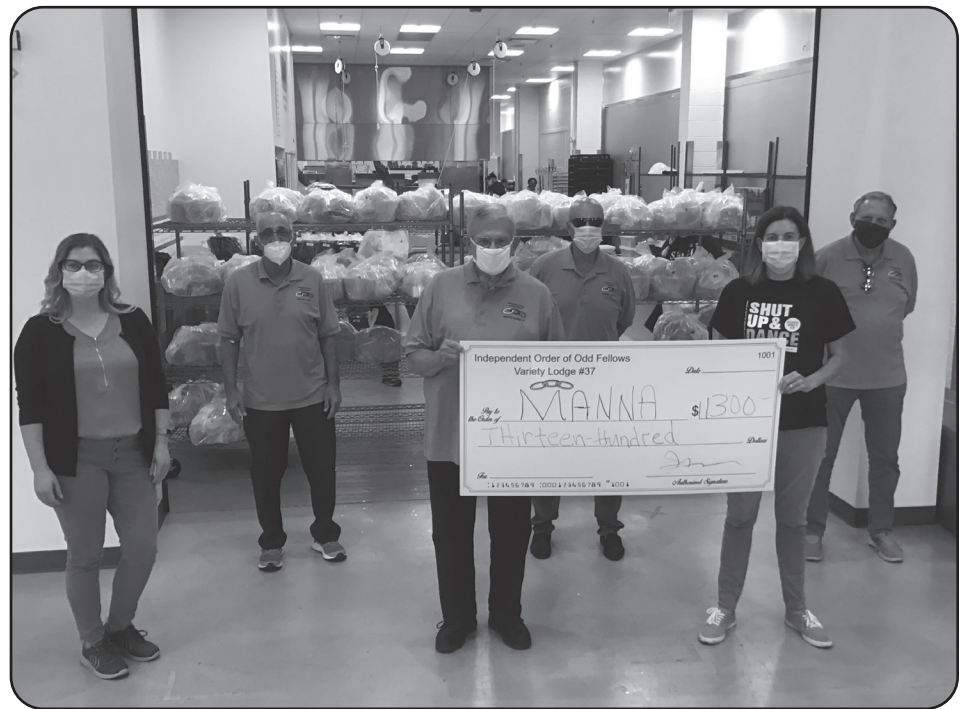
Surviving is his wife, the former Shirley Backenstose, three children, three grandchildren and one great-granddaughter.

BROTHER CLOSE STUMBLES UPON IOOF HISTORY

I received a text of a few pictures from Brother Doug Close over the July 4th weekend of a large block starting with "IOOF" on it. Doug Close, from Kingwood Lodge #1010 was spending the weekend in Benezette, Elk County, when he stumbled across an old foundation corner for the former Benezette Lodge #988, which lasted from 1882 - 1934. The inscription on the stone says "IOOF.988A141884." This is for IOOF Lodge 988 and 1884 was probably the date the Lodge was built. As for the A14, I am not sure. In 1920, the Lodge membership was 126. The census from that year was 758, so not a bad percentage. This was also home to Benezette Encampment #24, which lasted from 1908 - 1934 and Minnehaha Rebekah Lodge #110, which went defunct in 1900.

How did Doug come across this cornerstone? Someone saw his Kingwood IOOF Picnic shirt. They saw the IOOF on his shirt and it struck a note with them that there is another IOOF in their town!

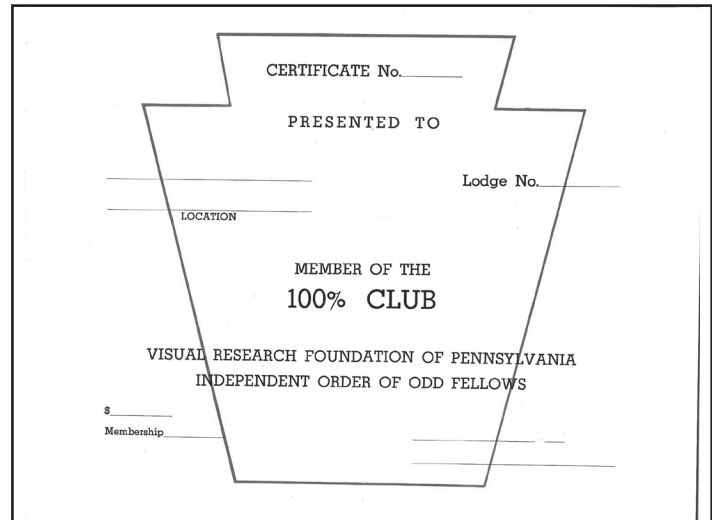
