SESSION 2020 CANCELLATION

To All Branches Of The Order,

It is with a heavy heart that I notify you that the Unified Session Committee for the 49th Unified Session scheduled for June 20-24, 2020 has decided to cancel the 2020 Unified Session.

The officers of the Session Committee (Dale Binkley, Mary DeLong, Sarah Baer and Judy Wert) along with Grand Master David Whitlinger and DGM Shirley Whitlinger met by conference call on Sunday April 19, 2020. There was a long discussion about the current COVID-19 pandemic and the effect it will have on our event. Almost every facet of our event will be affected - food service, large meeting groups, hotel cleaning being among the most obvious ones. Our primary concern is the health and well being of our membership. We, the Session Committee, cannot bring ourselves to urge attendance at an event where social distancing, glove usage, face masks and other safe practices cannot guarantee the continued good health of our attending members and guests. We also question how many members of the Order will attend with the health threat looming as a possibility.

The Session Committee will refund the money it has collected for Session Sponsorships, Program Book ads, flowers and Banquet tickets. The funds received for the Session raffle will be held for the time being and winners will be drawn at a future date.

It will be the responsibility of the presiding officer of each branch of the Order to determine how to proceed with any required business it should handle and the changeover of their officers. We would also ask that you notify the members of your branch that the Unified Session is cancelled and remind everyone to cancel any hotel reservations they may have made.

In closing, this decision was not taken lightly. The responsibility of ensuring the health of our members and guests weighed heavily in our decision to cancel this event. We are under contract to return to the Red Lion Hotel in June, 2021. We hope that by that time the decisions we make will be about how to run the event - not whether it should be held or not.

By the time this reaches you, I hope that many of the restrictions will be lifted or reduced. THE TREASURER'S TALES

JUNE 2020

We have been following Barney's exploits on a month by month basis and we are now at June 1925. One June 1 Lou Gehrig played his first game as a Yankee. On June 3 Eddie Collins had his 3,000th hit. Eddie played for the Philadelphia Athletics. On June 6, Walter Chrysler founded Chrysler Automobile Company. Barbara Bush was born on June 8. Audie Murphy was born on June 20. The Charlie Chaplin movie, *The Gold Rush*, appeared in theaters. *The Great Gatsby* was the most popular book of 1925. June 14, 1925 was flag day and it fell on Sunday. To avoid clashes with churches, the parade in Grover's Mill was held on Saturday, June 13, 1925. The parade had marching units, floats and some commercial exhibits. Most of the automobile dealers supplied convertibles to show off their vehicles. The Ford dealer entered a Model T touring car, Rolls Royce entered a Silver Ghost, Chrysler entered a Model B, Oakland and Studebaker entered cars as did Cadillac. As an aside, the Cadillac was originally built by Ford, but was sold to General Motors in 1909. There was a Stanley Steamer that was converted by American Steam Car Company. There was an Appersion in the parade (Bro. Seaton of Nathan Lewis Lodge has a restored model). The list goes on and a review of the cars alone lasted over an hour.

While there were many automobiles in the parade, at least half the floats were pulled by horses. A mixture of Percherons and Belgians wowed the crowd. The clean-up was still an issue, but the mounted units created the same problem. The First automobile held the Grand Master of New Jersey, followed by the local officers. The Lodge, Rebekah Lodge, Encampment, Canton and Auxiliary each had their float. Several lodges from adjoining towns had floats as well.

Barney was in charge of the Encampment float. He used a Noah's Ark theme. Owning a farm and having a veterinarian for a father-in-law made this a little easier.

Calves, piglets, lambs, chickens, dogs, cats, and raccoons were easy to supply. The more exotic you got the harder it was to find an animal. Barney was creative, enlisting Elizabeth to make costumes. Warden was a camel and Conductor was an elephant. With a barn full of cats, Barney thought lions and tigers would be easy, but that was before he tried to put a large tomcat in a costume. Vic was afraid he might have to put a stitch or two in Barney, but he was able to bandage his hand after some difficulty.

The juniors from the local high school were now seniors and they entered a float. They built the float to be a parody of their teachers. Students dressed to accentuate certain attributes of their teachers in a humorous way. If a teacher had an unusual hair style, it would be stressed in caricature. If the teacher dressed in outrageous clothes, then an imitator would be on the float. I suppose we should expect the students to be attentive to the stories that the teachers would tell. As you might guess, there was a student on the float dressed like a farmer wearing a World War I veteran's cap and holding a raccoon, representing our hero.

The Grand Lodge of New Jersey had a float with all sorts of farm implements and products. New Jersey is the Garden State and the Grand Lodge wanted to accentuate the state's claim to fame.

The marching units included Boy Scouts, the various units of the Odd Fellows and Veteran's units. The Grand Army of the Republic (Union Veterans of the Civil War) were too old to march, so they road in a wagon pulled by a pickup truck. The Grange had a float to represent a hay ride. The Canton could not muster enough horses, so the Chevaliers paraded on foot. The parade was a big event and drew a crowd from Trenton and Jersey City to watch. The local eateries were open during the parade and made a profit off the event.

The real merchandise sales took place in the park after the parade. There were food booths operated by every group. The booth that did the most business was the Rebekah booth, operated by Elizabeth and her mother Alice. When the crowd made its way to the park, the Rebekah booth was swamped.

In addition to food there were booths that sold fireworks, noise makers and other inexpensive toys for children. This caused lots of noise all over the park. The floats had parked on the edge of the park. There was a small bandstand that was set up to distribute awards after the sun went down. Barney waited for the awards because he thought the Noah's Ark float would get an award. He was right, the Encampment received second prize. A prudent man might take the animals home immediately after the parade. Prudent men were not in abundance. The awards did not last long and were followed by a fireworks display. Animals do not like fireworks. Think of an unwilling tomcat, forced into a lion costume. Chaos was the word of the day. It took Vic, Clancey and three other brothers to help Barney catch the animals on the float, not to mention the displeasure of the horses at the noise.

Once order was established, Barney and Vic took the animals back home. Barney had the only barn in New Jersey that had a tomcat in a lion costume, for three months, till it wore out. Alice and Elizabeth had saved an apple pie for Barney and Vic. During all the confusion, Melchizedek remembered that he like apple pie. Unguarded pies become the prey of mischievous raccoons. Barney and Vic went home to Vic's house to drink Ovaltine, Vic's favorite, and reminisce on the day's activities. There was no apple pie, only the dream.

There would be a much larger celebration on July 4, but that is another story. The red, second prize ribbon, was placed in the display case at the lodge. A copy of the newspaper article, describing the chaos after the fireworks was also put in the display case. Barney made a mental note of the student who had imitated him on the high school float. Melchizedek went back in the woods for a couple weeks of lounging. The world was peaceful in Grover's Mill while New York and Philadelphia were deep in the Roaring 20's.

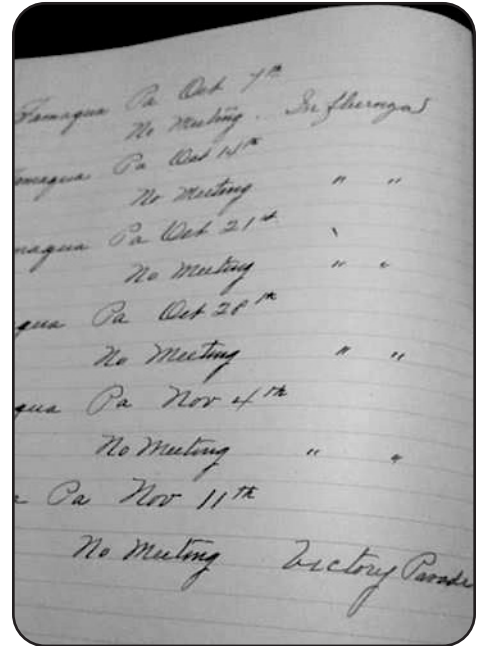

ANGELS OF CHRISTMAS INC. CELEBRATES 25 YEARS!!!

In 2012 at Walker Lodge, two IOOF brothers who joined the Odd Fellows together came in under unique circumstances. Past Grands Tom Kutchner and Mike Serverson are members of another charitable organization - Angels of Christmas Inc. which was formed in 1995 by Tom to help families in need during the Christmas season. The Angels of Christmas started with idea to help families with children's gifts and food at Christmas. At the first event, a handful of children received a couple of small gifts. The reaction of the children and families was so positive, Tom became determined to grow the organization for the following year. Through his passion to serve, the event has grown steadily from that first party. Today, the Angels organization provides year-round service to the local Philadelphia community (helping to defer education expenses for economically challenged children, food for families in need) as well as providing ambulatory donations in Haiti. In fact, Tom and Mike have visited Haiti twice and have funded the building of houses and providing supplies to one of the main hospitals in the country. How Tom and Mike became members of Walker Lodge is interesting. Someone provided a list of organizations that might contribute to the Angels and Walker was on the list. For several years, letters were submitted to Walker requesting donations which was always received and granted. During a chance meeting with a Walker member at a different organization's function, the member invited Tom and Mike to visit Walker Lodge for more information regarding Odd Fellowship. The visit sealed the deal!! Tom and Mike found brothers and sisters who shared their passion to provide aid and comfort to those less fortunate. As an expression of thanks, both joined Walker Lodge as well as other Associate Lodges and other branches (Encampment, Rebekahs, and Patriarchs Militant) and have become extremely active members and officers. They enjoy working with other the charities being supported at Walker and look forward to continuing to spread the Odd Fellow mission.

100 YEARS AGO

The application deadline for the 2020 Scholarship Award is June 13, 2020. A copy of the "Rules," along with an "Application," was sent to all the lodges representing the Western District in early May. 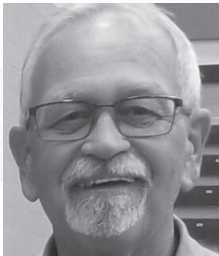
Tunkhannock Lodge No. 699

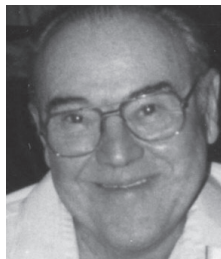
