## THE TREASURER'S TALES

### APRIL 2024

We are following the tales of Barney Wells, an Odd Fellow, farmer, high school English teacher and unsung hero. The time we are writing about is April 1929. Spring is beginning and we are still in the roaring twenties. Economic decline is in the offing. The crash will be in October but it will take a while for the effects of the Great Depression to be felt.

April 1929 had a few important events. On April 1, Louie Marx introduced the Yo-Yo. On April 16, Earl Averill, a rookie center fielder for Cleveland became the first American Leaguer to hit a home run on his first time at bat.

Many famous people were born in April 1929. On April 6, André Previn, German-American conductor (London Symphony) was born. On April 7, American mobster Joe Gallo was born in Brooklyn. On April 9, Harvey Liechtenstein, American head of the Brooklyn Academy of Music, was born in Brooklyn, New York. On April 10, actor Max von Sydow, was born in Lund, Sweden. On April 15, Adrian Cadbury, British confectionery manufacturer (Cadbury) and author of report on Corporate Governance, they still play Cadbury bunny commercials.

On April 4, Karl Benz, German auto maker died. He was the most notable person who died that month. Perhaps some of you own one of the cars made by his company, Mercedes-Benz.

Barney had been using a Model T Ford since he started driving, even before he fought in World War I. He had six Model T's sitting around his farm, including a tractor and two pickup trucks. Since the trade-in value was almost nothing, the license fee was low and no one had insurance, he kept the old cars. You may recall last July, he decided to go modern and bought a new Model A. This spring he bought a new tractor, and kept the old one as well. Barney was not a person who threw things away. He was not quite a hoarder, but he believed that you might need something after you quit using it, so he was reluctant to junk a car or piece of farm machinery. He plowed in March and planted in early April. He was ready to farm.

Barney knew the school year was drawing to a close. He needed to keep the students attention and that was difficult. Although some grammar is taught in 10th grade, most of the class is literature. Barney had used plays as the method for imparting literature, but he wanted to switch to book reports and oral presentations. This proved a challenge. One of the most popular books was *All Quiet on the Western Front*, a World War I novel, told from the German perspective. Since Barney had been there, done that and didn't have a good time, he rejected that novel as a subject for class study. The *House at Pooh Corner* was also very popular, but aimed at a younger audience. Many popular novels had too much sex and violence for a tenth grade classroom. This forced Barney to go to semi-classics. He decided on Sinclair Lewis' *Main Street* as the first book.

*Main Street* had been used before and the school library had a large number of copies. Barney structured the project to include reading chapter one aloud for several days, individual reading in class for a couple more days and a weekend for the students to take the book home and finish it. There was a general discussion to follow. At the conclusion, the class would be asked to write a paper in class. It would be a one period paper. By controlling the events and learning, Barney hoped to avoid some of the things that had happened in prior book reports.

Everything went as planned. Barney and the student took turns reading a couple pages at a time. The class was then given three days to read in class. A fast reader could easily complete the book by Friday. Sixteen year olds were preoccupied with other things and everyone took a copy home to finish over the weekend. Then the comment/discussion took place.

I insert this aside to give you a sketch of *Main Street* as I recall it. I read this book over 50 years ago. It was a story about a young librarian, Carol, recently graduated from college in Minnesota. She met an older man Will, who was a physician in a small town. He married her and took her to his small town in rural Minnesota, Gopher Prairie. She had a lot of misgivings about the town and did not adapt well. She had a child and lived there for some time, having interesting interactions with the residents. After a time, she left her husband and went to Washington, DC with

her son. She did not find it to be everything she wanted either. Will came to visit her in Washington and, after a time convinced her to return. After returning to Minnesota, she had a daughter and became more integrated into the community but was still unsure of her opinion on small town life. I believe Lewis was critical of unsophisticated and rural communities and sought to glorify more progressive ideas and social groups. My opinion is that Lewis was too arrogant in his books to convey a social message but achieved a significant degree of entertainment value. I believe I read four or five of his novels, many years ago.

The discussions were not easily forthcoming. Barney had to pull comments from the students, almost compelling them to speak. The girls were sympathetic toward Carol, but generally failed to understand the negative feeling toward small towns. Grovers Mill is a small town, with a 2023 population of 5,256. The boys were less interested in the social activities and criticisms, with most sympathizing with the small town attachments of Will and a few desiring to go to a larger city. The warm days were getting tiresome for the English class, when a noise was heard at the window. Pebbles were being thrown at the window. Looking out, Barney saw Melchizedek throwing pebbles at the window. Barney opened the window and yelled, scaring the raccoon away. The class was laughing.

Barney needed to bring the students back into the class. He discussed assigning a written report. This would be done in class the following week. When he went to his car, after school, Melchizedek was waiting for him. It had been a while since Easter and he wanted a treat from the humans. He had become dependent on the friendly Odd Fellows who adopted him. Barney sat him on the spare tire in the back, took him home and gave him a bowl of dog food, just his dogs Warden and Conductor. Taming a wild animal is dangerous and leads to animals thinking they are human (or pets).

The next week brought about no surprises. Monday's class period was given over to writing a report on the book. Tuesday, Barney read the reports aloud. He did not identify the authors. Some thought the book was about the street, ignoring the characters and talking about the buildings (which were not described in the book). A few wrote about the side characters, but most wrote about Carol, attempting to sympathize with her problems. A few others wrote about Will, and his service to the community. No one caught the sarcasm in Lewis novel, nor did any spot Lewis' bias and social activism. Tenth grade is too soon for comprehensive literary criticism.

Burial was held in Williams Cemetery, Huston Township, PA.



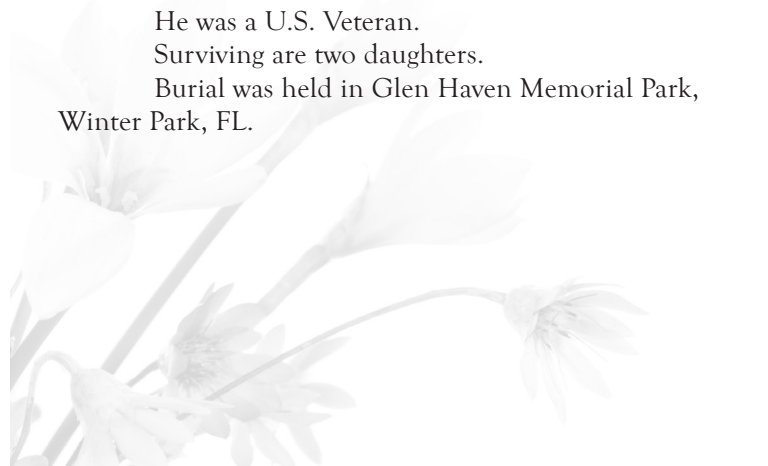
