# ODD FELLOWS & REBEKAHS ASSOC. OF W. PA 2025 SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

The Odd Fellows and Rebekahs Association of Western Pennsylvania is presently accepting applications for consideration in the awarding of a maximum of six (6) \$4,000 scholarships. This marks the 20<sup>th</sup> consecutive year that the Association has offered these Awards, having awarded an undergraduate total, thus far, of \$224,000. An application for the 2025 Scholarship Awards must be postmarked on or before Saturday, June 28, 2025. A copy of the "Rules," along with an "Application," was sent to all the lodges representing the Western District on April 1, 2025. All areas of concentration will be considered. An important reminder regarding three of the requirements for the Awards: 1) The applicant or a living family relative must be a member of the I.O.O.F or Rebekahs of Western Pennsylvania (formerly know as the Western Distrct, 2) The applicant must have completed at least one year at an accredited college/ university or technical/trade school, and 3) The applicant must be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate student at an accredited college/university or technical/trade school.

If interested in obtaining a copy of the "Rules" and an "Application," this can be done by: 1) contacting your Lodge secretary, 2) emailing Chairman Robert Grant at "robag@comcast.net," or 3) downloading from our website: "www.glpaioof.org" during the April through June time period. Again, an application will be only be accepted if received with a postmark date on or before June 28, 2025.

#### PHILADELPHIA'S REBEKAH LODGE CONSOLIDATES

On March 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Rebekah Assembly came down to Walker Hall in Philadelphia to consolidate Letitia Penn Rebekah Lodge #173 with Lady Harmony Rebekah Lodge #86. Letitia Penn Rebekah Lodge, named after William Penn's daughter, was chartered in 1888 in Penn Township. This was the Rebekah Lodge to Penn Township Lodge #319, who consolidated with Walker Lodge on May 16<sup>th</sup>, 1955. Over the years, as you will see in the monthly Rebekah Lodge listing article, there were many Rebekah Lodges that consolidated with Letitia Penn. There were many Past Grand Masters, and even a Past Sovereign Grand Master affiliated with this Lodge. Over the years, this Rebekah Lodge changed locations several times, meeting a lot at the old Home for Orphans of Odd Fellows in Philadelphia. When that got torn down, Letitia Penn eventually ended up in Walker Hall.

Though they had a secure location, membership started to dwindle. Several Rebekahs joined to try and help get Letitia Penn Rebekah Lodge meeting regularly, which was a success. They moved their meeting night to coincide with Canton Philadelphia No. 1, P.M., who all joined the Rebekahs to help them out. The Odd Fellow Lodges in the area were contacted in hopes to get a few more members, but there was no interest from that. Over the past year, only five regular members were able to come out to meet, and the membership dwindled to less than 10. Letitia Penn Rebekah Lodge determined the best idea was to reach out to Lady Harmony Rebekah Lodge #86 of Tamaqua, for consolidation.

Lady Harmony is honored and proud to carry on the traditions of Letitia Penn Rebekah Lodge No. 173. Six members came down on the 22<sup>nd</sup> to welcome them into Lady Harmony, and PNG Julie Stokes prepared a wonderful lunch for the ceremony. President Kate Walters presided over the consolidation, along with RA Sec Sarah Baer and acting Chaplain Mary D. Delong. We thank all who attended and look forward to a bright future with these two Rebekah Lodges working as one.

#### **TREASURER'S TALES -MAY 2025**

May is the month in which we celebrate Memorial Day. In years gone by, Memorial Day was always celebrated on May 30, regardless of the day of the week. In 1930, it was on Friday. The school year ended Thursday, May 29.

On May 5, Amy Johnson took off from England and became the first woman to fly from England to Australia. On May 14, Congress designated Carlsbad Caverns as a national park. May 21 Yankees' slugger Babe Ruth hits 3 home runs as NY blows 6-0 lead in 4th against Philadelphia A's at Shibe Park; and go on to lose, 15-7. On May 26, the Supreme Court ruled buying liquor does not violate the Constitution. On May 27, Richard Drew invented masking tape. On May 27, the 1,046-foot Chrysler Building in New York City, the tallest man-made structure at the time, opened to the public. On May 31, Philadelphia Athletics's Max Bishop draws 8 walks in a doubleheader to set major league baseball record.

On May 5, Will Hutchins [Marshall Hutchason], American actor (Sugarfoot; Spinout; Clambake), was born in Atwater, California. On May 31, Clint Eastwood was born in San Francisco, California.

Although signs of economic turmoil were evident in Europe, the United States was still doing fairly well. The wages held fairly steady, but prices for goods began a steady decline. The reasons for the Great Depression and mistakes in planning are a subject for some other time or column. The beginnings of the depression were seen everywhere in 1930.

In a previous column, I wrote about our own precious raccoon, Melchizedek and went through a zoology lesson on raccoons. This month I am going to give you a lesson on the historical character, Melchizedek.

Melchizedek, king of Salem and priest of God Most High, offers Abraham bread and wine after his victory in battle, blesses him, and receives a tithe (a tenth) of the spoils. If you received the degree of Patriarch Militant, you should recall this story. We see his name again in Psalm 110, verse 4, "The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind: 'You are a priest forever, in the order of Melchizedek." I will not offer an interpretation of the Psalmist meaning. Chapter 7 of Hebrews in the New Testament recounts the place of Melchizedek and relates Jesus to him. If you go to Bible Ask

Continuing on a serious note, we should take some time to delve into the scholarship that surrounds the lessons of Odd Fellowship. The degree structure did not exist when Thomas Wildey founded the Order in North America. It developed and changed over time. A serious student of our Order should research all the lessons in the various degrees and discover for himself or herself what the lessons really mean. Our degrees give you brief reference to lessons in the Holy Bible, it is for you to follow up on them. We do not tell you what to believe. That is a matter of your own conscience. That being said, let me commend the lessons from the degree work to be prompts for your own research.


Read the ritual, encourage your lodge to practice the Opening, Closing and Degrees. The more you recite the work and ponder it, the more meaning it will have for you.


#### FROM THE DEPARTMENT COMMANDER...

#### HONORING MAJOR GENERAL EDMUND H. SPANGLER, PDC

On a beautiful March afternoon I gathered with Chevaliers and family at the sacred grounds of Burns Hill Cemetery in Waynesboro to honor and remember our sixth Department Commander, Major General Sir Edmund H. Spangler, GDC and his wife Mary Spangler. Major General Spangler led the Pennsylvania Patriarchs Militant from 1941 to 1947. We took time on this day to visit his final resting place and recount his many contributions to



Sunday School program.




In 1917 Edmund Spangler entered the printing business with his brother William. Named the Caslon Press, the business flourished and the ownership and management of it by the Spangler brothers allowed their families to be successful and well respected community members. While business, church and service organization involvement were hallmarks of Edmund Spangler's gifts to the community of Waynesboro, it was in Odd Fellowship that he achieved significant state wide recognition.

School aspect of his church and was for many years the president of the

Edmund Spangler first joined Odd Fellows in 1912 by becoming a Brother of Waynesboro Lodge #219 (now consolidated with Newburg Lodge #562). He was Exalted to the Royal Purple Degree as a member of Widow's Friend Encampment #71 of Waynesboro (now with Valley Encampment #34) where he became Past Chief Patriarch by 1926 and then took the Grand Encampment Degree in 1931. He was serving as President of the Past Grands Association of Franklin County by the late 1920's as well as holding the office of DDGM for the region. By 1941 he was a Grand Encampment Officer under Grand Patriarch J.B. Mentzer. Brother Spangler also spent considerable effort in proficiently conducting degree work. An example of his skill in this regard can be found in the May 14, 1919 edition of the Waynesboro Record newspaper which gives an account of a degree offered by Waynesboro Lodge #219 in which over two hundred brothers watched 70 candidates receive the Second Degree under the direction of Degree Master Spangler. The article goes on to state that the Lodge was well known in the Jurisdiction for conducting an impressive Second Degree thanks to Brother Spangler.

Patriarch Spangler then chose to enter the highest degree of our Order by becoming a Chevalier of Pennsylvania Patriarchs Militant Canton Chambersburg #51, where by 1931 he was serving as Captain. He was instrumental in the institution of Canton Waynesboro #57 in 1941 and this became Brigadier General Spangler's home Canton (this Canton went defunct 1968). Brigadier General Spangler steadily rose through the ranks until late 1941 when our Jurisdiction got news of the appointment



We also took time on this day to remember Mrs. Mary Spangler, for she too was an Odd Fellow and dedicated many years to the good work of the Rebekah branch of our Order. She was a long time member of Lady Wayne Rebekah Lodge #585 of Waynesboro (as was her husband) where she was the charter Nobel Grand and was the first President of the Past Grand Association in that region. She was also a member of the L.A.P.M. We respect the many years of her life that she dedicated to our Order and the faithful assistance that she gave to Major General Spangler in the carrying out of his duties as a Chevalier in the Department of Pennsylvania, Patriarchs Militant.



Our Sister Mary Spangler died in May of 1946, aged 67 years, less than one year before her beloved husband. Major General Spangler sadly died at the relatively young age of 65, in Waynesboro hospital, on February 4, 1947. While he had become weak about a month before his death, newspaper accounts indicate that Major General Spangler did not fully relinquish his duties as Department Commander until a short ten days before his death. Thus we see that to the end, our departed Past Department Commander held close to the Order that was central to his life for thirty-five years. He surrendered his responsibilities reluctantly and carried out his duty to our Army until the end. The Chevaliers of Pennsylvania lost their leader before his term in office was completed, but they knew that he left our ranks strong due to his popular and effective leadership.

Reflections and comments on the Spanglers were offered by two very special guests at our ceremony - Mr. David Etter and Mr. Todd Dorsett - descendents of the Spangler family. They offered interesting family insights into the lives and times of Major General and Mrs Spangler. I also spoke with a great-grandson in Florida who was fascinated by our interest and was kind enough to send pictures of the Spanglers. Also participating were past Department Commander Major General Sir Justin Bailey, GDC, who sounded taps, and Deputy Department Commander Colonel J. Carl George, who provided a prayer taken from our Department of Pennsylvania Memorial Service. Mr. Etter and Mr. Dorsett reverently placed Odd Fellow and Rebekah flags at their ancestors' graves.

We concluded this solemn visit to the final resting place of Major General and Mrs.Spangler by assuring them, on behalf of the Department of Pennsylvania, Patriarchs Militant, I.O.O.F., and all of Odd Fellowship, that we continue to both carry on the ancient principles of our Order and affirm our commitment to carry on their good work. The great Fraternal Order that the Spanglers selflessly committed much of their lives to will always cherish their memory as they continue to rest in peace together as they have for over 75 years.
